What it looks like to take care (and not):

i) glazing over

Vs proactivity

ii) giving up

Vs perseverance

iii) getting distracted

Vs passion

Conclusion: Holding fast modelled

- When are we tempted to glaze over, give up, or get distracted from God's word?

- How can we work on our proactivity? Perseverance? Passion? How might we help one another with these?
