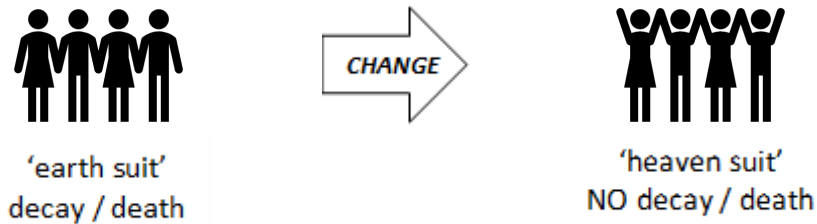

Introduction: Christians shall certainly be changed



i) Change is necessary because earth bodies won't work in heaven (v50 & v53)

ii) Change could be imminent & will be unmissable (v51-52)

iii) Change gives reason to celebrate because death will be defeated (v54-57)

Application: So, working in the Lord is worth it / not in vain (v58)

What stops us believing that it could happen at any moment?

How does the certainty that death will be defeated motivate us to work in the Lord now?
